Kate Ansay, Director of Ansay International presented the Small Business of the Year Award to Messina Restaurant in Saukville. Messina opened in 2006 at its Saukville location and has continued to grow and prosper. They have added an outdoor seating area and have become a significant catering operation since opening. John Tokarz of Reinhart presented the Large Business of the Year Award to Wilo, LLC. Wilo USA is a Subsidiary of Wilo SE and manufactures pumps and systems for HVAC, water supply, sewage disposal and drainage. Wilo currently operates three divisions within Cedarburg, Weil Pump, Scot Pump and Wilo Machine Company. Wilo has expanded its current operations 31,000 square feet at its Weil Pump facility and has added over 25 new jobs. Jeff Plaster, CEO/Managing Director at Weil Pump, accepted the award for Wilo. He thanked his company for its commitment to the community and the staff at all three divisions.
